WHEREAS, in the 2018 Audubon Society's National Bird Count, held on December 30, 2018, there were 29 Snowy Owls counted in the Rudyard Christmas Bird Count that day;

WHEREAS, based on the success of the 2017 and 2018 Rudyard Christmas Bird Count sponsored by the National Audubon Society;

NOW THEREFORE LET BE RESOLVED THAT:

Rudyard Township adopts the snowy owl as the official Rudyard Township bird and designates Rudyard Township as the SNOWY OWL CAPITAL OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN.
